Since that time, he has served on several influential committees. As Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources committee, Sen. Cowles is on the frontline of issues relating to Wisconsin's water, hunting, and fishing, and creating a healthy balance between the needs of businesses and protecting our environment. As the Chairman of the Energy Committee, Senator Cowles has been recognized by both environmental and commercial groups for his leadership.

Sen. Cowles proved to be an invaluable ally by drafting critical improvements to the Polluter Grab Bag Bill last year before allowing it to pass through his committee. He was also one of the lead sponsors of a bill to protect the Great Lakes from dangerous plastic microbeads and authored a bill to restore funding for recycling programs. For these efforts and more, he was named to our Conservation Honor Roll this year, and earned our endorsement in the November 8th election. Sen. Cowles has also been on the Conservation Honor Roll in previous legislative sessions and was awarded Wisconsin Wildlife Federation's Legislator of the Year Award.
